

Change in ES capacity-While the quantity of ES beds did not change drastically, a new facility was opened up that consolidated 2 ES facilities into one with an emphasis on low barrier shelter practices and new services that allowed space for storage of items as well as a safe place to stay throughout the day. This new shelter also improved the quality and timeliness of shelter data being provided resulting in a more accurate count. Change in TH capacity-The largest change in our sheltered count is due to the opening of a hotel voucher shelter program. This include larger families and clients with criminal backgrounds that often serve as a barrier to entering other programs. Change in RRH capacity-Due to staffing challenges and organizational capacity for our largest rapid rehousing provider for singles, the number of households being served in RRH was lower at the time of the count than most months prior to count. This led to a higher number of people being in shelter also.

Street outreach has been a strategic emphasis for our CoC over the past 12 months with the goal of developing a by-names list that is maintained frequently. New relationships have been developed with volunteer outreach groups and additional street outreach staff have been hired in our CoC. These outreach efforts collaborate through the Heartland Continuum of Care Street Outreach Task Groups to case conference individuals who are unsheltered and to map locations that should be visited by outreach personnel. These efforts provided information that helped conduct the count and the relationships developed by outreach staff and volunteers helped in getting PIT assessments completed. Due to inclement weather on the night of our scheduled PIT count in January, we conducted the count on Feb 26th, 2024. The weather was unseasonably high on the date of the count with temps reaching 76 degrees which was a contributing factor in the number of people who were unsheltered during that count.
